
EARLY CHILDHOOD REGIONAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Using a Collective Impact Model, between September 2022 and June 2023, Birth to Five IL led their Action and Family Councils through data discussions to identify gaps and barriers for children and families throughout Central IL. They coordinated focus groups, interviews, and surveys to gather input from community members across the Region. See the findings, regional strengths, family- and community-identified needs, and recommendations for how to make our Region's Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) programs more accessible and equitable to children, families, and ECEC providers.

This summer and fall, the Birth to Five IL Team will work with their Action and Family Councils to share the report's findings throughout the Region, keeping with their mission to capture as much input as possible.


RIBBON CUTTINGS CONTINUED


