


HISTORY

Founded by Isaac Swan in 1825, Canton has a long and fascinating history. It is populated with inventors and adventurers as diverse as Elizabeth Magie, a contributor to the creation of the Monopoly board game, and Charles Duryea, who actually developed the first practical automobile. Astronaut Colonel Steve Nagle, the 100th American in space, is from Canton, as is Bill Cook, founder of Cook Group, Inc., the largest privately held medical device manufacturer in the world. Perhaps fitting, since Canton is surrounded by rich and bountiful farmland, the town is best known for the genius of William Parlin, and his business partner, William Orendorff, who created the P&O Plowworks, which later became International Harvester - Canton Works.

The Canton community today has the same drive for innovation and creative thinking, thriving when other small communities may have lost sight of the very thing that made them special.

We cherish our heritage, we take advantage of the opportunities available today, and we can't wait for the future.

city government

The City of Canton operates under a Mayor-aldermanic form of government, with a Mayor as the chief executive officer and eight aldermen, representing four wards, serving as the City Council.

Administration of City government is headed by the Mayor who is elected on at-large basis for a four-year term. Although the Mayor and aldermen all serve for four years, half of the city council members are up for elections every two years.

The City Council makes up the policy that directs the City government to meet the wants and needs of its residents. The City Council has the responsibility for setting all municipal policies not designated by City charter or state legislation such as adopting ordinances and resolutions and approving the city budget.

The City Council meets on the first and third Tuesdays of every month. Eight committees, each with a chairman, are comprised to present and work through City issues in order to recommend policy. Those committees include:

Finance Community & Industrial Development Negotiations, Grievance & Personnel Public Works, Water & Sewer Streets & Garbage Lake, Buildings & Ground Public Safety & Traffic Legal & Ordinance

Meetings are held at the historic train depot located at 50 N. 4th Ave. (Donald E. Edwards Way) Meetings begin at 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise noticed. All agendas and minutes are posted on this website under Resident Information, Agendas/Minutes. Agendas are also posted onsite at the Depot at least 48 hours in advance, per the Open Meetings Act. Minutes are posted on this website after approval by council at the following meeting.



All citizens are encouraged to attend and participate in these meetings. Citizens are allowed to address the council by completing a Public Participation Request Form (available at cantonillinois.org) and submitting it to the City Clerk by noon on the Friday prior to the meeting at which they wish to speak.



Garbage Collection

Garbage pick-up is paid for through your water/sewer invoice. Contact the Canton Water Department at (309) 647-0288 to determine your pick-up day. NOTE: The City of Canton garbage trucks will NOT pick up appliances, furniture, electronics, paint and/or chemicals, or yard waste.

Yard Waste Disposal

As a convenience to its residents, the City of Canton maintains a yard waste disposal site for the dumping of grass clippings, tree or bush trimmings, discarded landscaping plants, limbs and other bio-degradable materials. It NOT a site to dispose of garbage, hazardous waste, appliances, furniture, electronics, paint and/or chemicals. It is located at the west end of Cedar Street on the southwestern corner of the city limits.

Recycling Program

Recycling services in Canton are available from a private outside contractor who provides containers for qualifying recyclable materials. No sorting is required.

The service is billed independently by the contractor, not through the City.

There is no admission charge.








CANTON PARK DISTRICT TRAIL SYSTEM



Emiquon refuge was established in 1993 by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service to restore and protect wetland habitats at the confluence of the Illinois and Spoon rivers. The first tract of the refuge was purchased on December 29, 1993. The refuge has since grown to 2,114 acres. In total, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has authorization to purchase 11,122 acres within the Emiquon Project area.

The Illinois River National Wildlife & Fish Refuge
Complex stretches along 124 miles of the Illinois River in
west central Illinois, and consists of three refuges;
Emiquon, Chautauqua and Meredosia, totaling 12,163
acres of backwater lakes, bottomland forests, floodplain
wetlands and upland habitats. Whether bird watching,
fishing, hunting or taking pictures, there are many ways to
enjoy refuge lands:

- All land and water areas on the refuge are open daily from sunrise to sunset.
- Take a scenic walk along the Bellrose Trail. This trail is named for the late waterfowl biologist Frank C. Bellrose.
- Pets are welcome, but must be leashed except when participating in legal hunting activities.
- The possession and consumption of alcohol is prohibited on the refuge.
- Off road vehicle use/ATV use, fires/fire works, and camping are prohibited on the refuge.
- Watch waterfowl and other birds from refuge trails, levees and other access points. Peak waterfowl migrations occur in early-March and mid-November.
- Pick mushrooms and berries; collect nuts.
- Sport fishing is permitted on any refuge waters.

Remember that the use of motorized boats are permitted at no wake speeds only.

• Hunting is open on specified areas north of the Spoon River. See refuge regulation sheet for detailed hunting information.



Emiquon Preserve is more than a story of rebirth; it is a living laboratory, one of the best places in the United States to study wetland restoration. The 7,100-acre preserve, an hour downstream from Peoria, once ranked among the biologically richest wetlands in Illinois and throughout the world. However, the natural wetlands were converted into farmland for most of the 20th century, which isolated the area from the Illinois River, and prevented the area from serving as a natural flood plain.

In spring 2007, The Nature Conservancy turned off the pumps that had dried out the land since the 1920s. Within months, water reappeared in the historic beds of Thompson and Flag lakes, drowning the nearly century-old cornfields, and native plants began pushing up through the soil, where their seeds had lain dormant for years. The transformation from agriculture to wetland went quickly, though the work is far from over.

Emiquon is a an experience for the whole family, with lessons in history, conservation, nature and the wonderful cycle of the earths' natural order. Recently named a Wetland of International Importance, the project is ongoing, and always fluid.

Big Creek Skate Park is located near the Baker Recreation Center, adjacent to the dog park. It is open for public use during park hours.












Lakeland Park

Lakeland Park is a great example of positive cooperation between local, state and federal agencies and the private sector. Officially opened to the public in 1981, the park is a showcase of the recreational potential of reclaimed coal strip-mined lands. Fulton County is very rich in history as a major coal mining area and Lakeland Park will always stand to remind future generations of that era. The Consolidated Coal Company donated the nearly 450 acres of land and water to the District and the park was developed by state and federal grants.

The park contains over 5 miles of hiking trails, picnic shelters, playgrounds, fishing opportunities, scuba diving, a Veteran's Memorial and other natural areas.







Lakeland Park

Fishing

Lakeland Park is home to great recreational fishing. This area features 100 acres of water over five different lakes in which patrons can either fish from the bank, or out on the water. Lakes are stocked each year with a variety of sport fish including: Largemouth bass, hybrid bass, channel cat, walleye, crappie, tiger Muskie, northern pike, bluegill, and sunfish. 
Hiking/Biking Trails

Bird Watching

Lakeland plays hosts to a number of different bird species including ducks, geese, swans, white pelicans, egrets, herons, wrens, woodpeckers, sparrows, gulls, as well as the customary robins, cardinals, finches, hummingbirds, doves, chickadees, nuthatch, and blue jays. Birds of prey can also be spotted such as the red-tailed hawk, barred owl, turkey vulture, and on occasion the bald eagle.





Wallace Park

Wallace Park is the operational hub of the Canton Park District and houses the Donaldson Community Center, administrative offices and maintenance facilities.

The Donaldson Community Center was recently improved to allow for all public activities to be held on the first floor.

The Park itself offers many recreational activities; two that stand out are the one-half mile hiking trail and the accessible playground.

Pavilion

Wallace Park Pavilion is located within Wallace Park at 250 South Avenue D in Canton. It features a pavilion that can be rented out for \$50/day. Canton Lake

Canton Lake is a freshwater reservoir located in Fulton County, Illinois known for its trophy sized largemouth bass and its abundant channel catfish. Fishing is available from shore at various points just off the lake road. The Old Boat Dock is a great place for family fishing, with several areas to cast a line from and accessible parking for more than one vehicle. Fishing is also popular along much of the perimeter of the New Boat Dock and beyond. Numerous parking spaces are available there.

Canton Lake offers fishing, boating, and a seasonal campground.

To contact the Campground Supervisor about camping, please call 309-647-9600. To inquire about or purchase a boat license, contact the Water Department at 309-647-0288.

The Canton Lake Campground season begins April 15th and ends the Monday after the Spoon River Scenic Drive, which is mid-October. Campground options include tents, tents with electric, and camping with electric. Tent camping is on a daily basis and arrangements for campers include daily, weekly, monthly and the entire season. Daily checkout time is 1 p.m. In the event of severe weather, a storm shelter is located at the Water Treatment Plant.

Boat licenses are available at varying rates for boats with no motor and electric, less than 20-horsepower, 20- to 39.99-horsepower and 40- to 90-horsepower. Boat licenses also are available at discounted rates for senior citizens ages 65 and older.






