
DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

**STATE OF ILLINOIS
COUNTY OF FULTON
CITY OF CANTON**

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Mayor by the Illinois Municipal Code (60 ILCS 5/11-1-6), the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act Section 3305/11, and Ordinance No. 4182 of the City of Canton, I, Kent McDowell, the Mayor of City of Canton, do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency: (1) existed as of March 17, 2020, when I initially declared a Local State of Emergency; (2) continues to exist at of this date, April 7, 2020; (3) and shall continue until such time as provided in Ordinance No. 4182.

Facts Related to Emergency: In late 2019, a new and significant outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) emerged in China. COVID-19 is a novel severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among people through respiratory transmissions and present with symptoms similar to those of influenza. There is no vaccine currently available for COVID-19. Certain populations are at higher risk of experiencing more severe illness as a result of COVID-19, including older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions such as heart disease, diabetes, or lung disease.

The City of Canton is continuing its efforts to prepare for any eventuality given that this is a novel illness and given the known health risks it poses for the elderly and those with serious chronic medical conditions. The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a Public Health Emergency of International Concern on January 30, 2020; the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services declared that COVID-19 presents a public health emergency on January 27, 2020; and, the Governor of the State of Illinois, J.B. Pritzker, proclaimed COVID-19 a Disaster on March 9, 2020.

In response to the COVID-19 outbreaks, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (“CDC”) has deemed it necessary to prohibit or restrict non-essential travel to or from those countries, and federal, state, and local officials have continued to impose restrictions, such as “stay at home” orders, in order to reduce the spread of the COVID-19.

As of April 7, 2020, the Illinois Department of Public Health indicated 13,549 positive (confirmed) cases of COVID-19 with 380 deaths (*see* www.dph.illinois.gov/topics-services/diseases-and-conditions/diseases-a-z-list/coronavirus). One of the confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Illinois has not been linked to any travel activity or to an already-confirmed COVID-19 case, which indicates community transmission in Illinois. On March 14, 2020, the Illinois Department of Public Health confirmed a patient tested positive for a strain of COVID-19 in Woodford County, located in Central Illinois. Thereafter, on March 16, 2020, the Peoria City/County Health Department confirmed the first positive case of COVID-19 in Peoria County, Illinois. Since then, surrounding counties of Knox, Peoria, and Mason have all had positive (confirmed) COVID-19 cases.


Nature of Emergency: The COVID-19 outbreak is a “disaster” and “public health emergency” as defined under 20 ILCS 3305/4, as amended. While there are no known, confirmed cases of COVID-19 existing within the corporate limits of the City of Canton at the time of this Declaration, there is an imminent threat that outbreak of COVID-19 may spread to within the corporate limits of the City of Canton, resulting in or threatening the death or injury of persons to such an extent that extraordinary measures must be taken to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency declared hereunder, the Mayor shall execute such authority and executive orders as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Ordinance No. 4182.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the City Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, KENT McDOWELL, whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.


