


WELCOME NEW MEMBER CENTRAL ILLINOIS AGENCY ON AGING

CITY OF CANTON REPORT

The first quarter of any given year is one of change, most notably in the weather as it swings from the dark cold of January winter into motivating milder temperatures of March. In this first quarter, we endured an extreme stretch of sub-zero temperatures. This resulted in a series of three water main breaks all on the coldest, fiercest day of all, and they occurred right on the heels of a significant snowfall. After being called out at 2:00am to plow snow for 13 hours, city crews dealt with the main breaks until 8:00 that night. I am grateful for our employees that put in extraordinary hours and face adverse conditions to restore our services.

Now as weather improves, projects continue. Work on the Water Treatment Plant is completed. Funding is being sought for improvements at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, a second round of Lead Service Line Replacements, and replacement of the West

Hickory water line. Another new project will be repairs to the bridge on West Walnut Street over Big Creek.


Replacement of sidewalk/curb/gutter in the 100 block of N. Main Street is in design phase. This area near Don & Nancy's Café has been in poor condition for years, but has been complicated by a basement that extends out under the sidewalks.

Spring brings people outdoors to our Lake Canton trail system, where I'm excited to share news of two new trail benches, generously donated by a team of employees at COOK Medical, in honor of one of their employees. Many people will appreciate these benches.

Finally, we note the passing of our former Ward 3 Alderman, Quin Mayhew. Quin served for the City from August, 2018 until May, 2021. He was a perfect example of what you want in a representative. He was intelligent, fair, logical, and listened to his constituents and his city department heads. They will tell you that Quin was a wonderful person to work with.

As with life, the City keeps moving on. Canton has a lot of potential and hope for the future, so let's see what the next quarter brings us.
