NEW MEMBER NAVIGATOR CO2

Navigator CO2 announced its intention to construct and operate the Heartland Greenway project in 2021. The leadership team saw a growing demand for lower carbon solutions and the potential for Carbon Capture Utilization and Storage (CCUS) to be a game-changer for the agriculture industry and for communities across the Midwest.

The Heartland Greenway project is a forward-thinking, scalable infrastructure investment that will materially reduce participants' carbon intensity and further the goal of carbon neutrality. We are pioneering a path to sustainable carbon solutions, while maximizing value for all stakeholders in the new carbon economy. The system will provide biofuel producers and other rural industrial processors in Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, and South Dakota with a



long-term and cost-effective means to reduce their carbon footprint. Once fully expanded, the project will have the ability to capture and store 15 million metric tons of CO2 every year. It will be built with highly skilled labor to ensure it is constructed safely and to last.

The Heartland Greenway project covers 291 miles in Illinois, 16 of which are in Fulton County. It is the company's mission to be good neighbors in the communities they serve. As stewards of the land, they look forward to working with landowners and community leaders to ensure a safe project that will provide economic certainty to Canton and the surrounding communities.

Rancho Nuevo plans to remain open for the years to come because not only was it a dream of Adolfo's to manage and own his own restaurant in the community that provided so much for his family, but to give back in various ways. "We have always felt immense support from the community for years and are happy to finally be giving back to the community that has watched and helped us grow in Canton, IL. Canton will always be our home, and we will continue to help the community in any way we can".
