We are happy to announce Youth Acres as our Canton Main Street Spotlight of the Month! Youth Acres is located at 26400 N Youth Acres Rd. Youth Acres takes up two peninsulas of Lake Canton and boasts 70 acres of woods and open fields. Youth Acres has been a member and supporter of Canton Main Street for many years and has donated the use of some of their picnic tables during our annual Canton Art on Main Fine Arts Festival.

Youth Acres began its formation in early 1942 under the leadership of Doctor PD Reinersten, with membership of the Rotary Club, Kiwanis Club, YMCA, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and the Indian Guide Tribes. This group formed a corporation known a Canton Youth Organization. This organization then entered into a lease with the City of Canton for 7 acres of land. This land adjacent to Lake Canton was leased for the use of activities for the young people of Canton and Fulton County. By 1947 other service organizations and churches joined in sponsoring this organization and the name Youth Acres was chosen for the site. Within a few years, under the chairmanship of Fred Hand, the facilities at Youth acres were completed, a road was built, a field house erected, and the official opening date was June 10, 1950.

Since its opening date it has expanded to 70 acres and the area has been used continuously for a youth camp and picnic ground for various youth organizations of Canton and the surrounding counties. It has provided a natural setting for overnight camping, day trips, church services, picnics, fishing, boating, nature walks and much more.

John Green, President of the Board of Directors, has been involved with Youth Acres for 30 years and has been very instrumental in overseeing the growth of Youth Acres today. Under his leadership, Youth Acres has hosted hundreds of Boy Scout/Girl Scout and Cub Scout outings and has developed a venue for weddings with an outdoor chapel. John has also worked with Outward Ingersoll at Canton's



Ingersoll Middle School to bring Outward Ingersoll out to Youth Acres and Lake Canton. According to Board member, Jan Purtle, thousands of 8th grade children have gone through the Outward Ingersoll experience with a better understanding of lake ecology, first aid, paddling a canoe, building a fire, archery, and many other outdoor skills. In 2012, with a generous donation by Canton resident Nancy Elson, Youth Acres was able to build six small bungalows and six cabin-style bungalows that can be rented for overnight.

John has serval goals he tries to meet each year for Youth Acres. One is the execution of their Chicken Noodle Dinner fundraiser. This year's fundraiser was held on March 7th at the VFW with a live auction. John plans to dedicate half of the proceeds to help build a handicapped accessible blacktop trail through the woods on the grounds.

Youth Acres is a non-profit organization and any donations they receive are tax deductible. Limited United Way funding is the only consistent funding that Youth Acres receives in addition to income generated from facility use, but over the years that funding has decreased and does not keep up with the need. Youth Acres does not have any paid staff or maintenance personnel but has been in existence for over 75 years due in large part to the goodwill and volunteerism of the Board Members and the people of Fulton County. Youth Acres is always looking for strong volunteers. There is a lot of physically demanding work that takes

place at Youth Acres, and a strong back willing to help is always welcome.

How Important is the 2020 Census?

Census responses provide data that can attract new businesses and the jobs that come with them. The data also informs where over \$675 billion in federal funding is spent each year in states and communities that includes money for things like:

- Medicare Part B
- Special education
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- Cooperative Extension Service
- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant
- Water and waste disposal systems for rural communities

Responses to census questions provide a sanpshot of the nation. Census results affect your voice in government, how much funding your community receives, and how your community plans for the future. When you fill out the census, you help:

- Determine how many seats your state gets in Congress
- Create jobs, provide housing, prepare for emergenceis, and build schools, roads and hospitals.

What info. does the 2020 Census ask?

Number of people at address

They ask this question to collect an accurate count of the number of people at each address on Census Day, April 1, 2020.

Any additional people living or staying there

They ask this question to ensure that everyone living at an address is counted.

Owner/Renter

They ask this question to create statistics about homeownership and renters.

Phone Number

They ask this question in case they need to contact you.

Name

They ask this question to ensure everyone in the household is counted. This also helps them to keep ancestry records.



Sex

They ask this question to create statistics about males and females.

Age and date of birth

They ask this question to understand the size and characteristics of different age groups and to present other data by age.

Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin

They ask this question to create statistics about this ethnic group.

Race

They ask this question to create statistics about race and to present other statistics by race groups.

Whether a person lives or stays somewhere else

They ask this question to ensure individuals are not included at multiple addresses.

Relationship

They ask about the relationship of each person in a household to one central person to create estimates about families, households, and other groups.

Responding is safe; your personal information is kept confidential by law. Responding is easy; fill out the Census online, by phone or by mail. So make sure you fill out your Census and make sure to tell others how important it is to fill theirs out too!
