A very fun part of the year is coming in November and the Canton Area Chamber of Commerce is excited to be involved in both!

Small Business Saturday is a day dedicated every year to support and celebrate small businesses across the United States. Started in 2010 by American Express it is celebrated on the Saturday after Thanksgiving to encourage consumers to get out and shop at their local neighborhood stores. This year Small Business Saturday will be on Saturday, November 26th.

According to a survey done in November of 2021 by American Express, about half (49%) of Americans participated in Small Business Saturday last year, with an average spending of \$305. That amount mostly include gifts, as 65% of consumers say they'll purchase at least some presents at small businesses.

Let's increase participation this year to 100% for Small Business Saturday by shopping at as many of our local stores and restaurants as you can during the entire holiday season.

Another exciting thing that begins on November 26th is the new Holiday Light Show. It will take place at Big Creek Park. Tickets are \$5 per car. The Canton Chamber is very excited to be working with Tim & Peyton Lindsey, the two responsible for the original Lindsey Light Show in 2020 which is how the Holiday Light Show became a reality. Q: Does it really make a difference shopping local?

A: Yes it does! When you shop local not only are you stimulating our local economy but you are also supporting a local family, neighbor or friend. Those who own their own business are investing in their local community by bringing services or unique shopping experiences to help enhance our town.

For every \$100 spent, roughly \$68 to \$73 of it returns to local activity. Local business owners know you, and you know them. Studies have shown that local businesses donate to community causes at more than twice the rate of chains.

Local businesses not only pay their employees, they also spend money at other local businesses. That means by buying local, you help create jobs, contribute to improved public infrastructure, and invest in your community both socially and economically.

WELCOME NEW MEMBER

Spoon River Junction Winery has a purpose - to create new wines that blur lines and expand the boundaries of what wine can be. However, first and foremost, everything they make still has to taste not just good, but amazing!

Owner, Bradley Beam has been making wine for over 20 years, both academically and commercially. He served as the Illinois state enology specialist from 2006-2018, and still



takes on special projects with the Illinois Grape Growers and Vintners Association. He's also an independent wine making consultant for several wineries in the Midwest.

Brad states, "The first wines from this project are all aged in used bourbon barrels for at least 6-12 months to add a layer of complexity to what might otherwise be pretty straight-forward wines. Warm wood and vanilla flavors are balanced with the naturally fruity wine flavor profiles, and the barrels also add some tannin and heat to the finish, creating something like a lower-alcohol, easy-drinking cocktail. We decided to do these wines from the start to make a statement about our adventurous philosophy and set the tone for what we hope is a long career developing new, creative, and fun wines."

Their mission is clear at Spoon River Junction Winery; Creative and inventive wines. They are committed to creating new products that expand the definition of quality wine. The winery sources fruit and other ingredients locally whenever possible, and showcase the local artist community in the tasting room. Can't make the trip to the winery, no worries because they will ship their products to you, wherever you are.
