SHOP LOCAL SEASON IS HERE!

Small Business Saturday is coming! This is a day dedicated every year to support and celebrate small businesses across the United States. Started in 2010 by American Express, it is celebrated on the Saturday after Thanksgiving to encourage consumers to shop at their local stores. This year Small Business Saturday will be on Saturday, November 25th.

For small business owners, their business is an extension of who they are. Supporting the local businesses within our community not only keeps those businesses alive, but also keeps the communities they serve thriving. This year, before heading out of town or jumping online to shop, support our local businesses including bakeries, restaurants, retailers, unique boutiques, and neighborhood stores. For every dollar spent at a small business, 67 cents stays within our local economy. In addition to helping schools and other organizations through taxes, small businesses are also often supporters of our local sports teams, charities and events.

According to an October 4, 2023 Forbes magazine article, after two years of people's holiday activities being curtailed by the pandemic, they are more than ready to meet their neighbors and friends. Small Business Saturday which is a great reason to get out and about.

As many people, even slightly more, may turn out for Small Business Saturday (59%) as for Black Friday (56%), a survey conducted by YouGov for Bankrate.com revealed. And another conducted by Teneo on behalf of Kabbage by American Express over 1,000 adults found over half of shoppers (53%) said they plan to shop local or eat at an independently-owned restaurant during this year's Small Business Saturday.

At Canton Learning Collaborative, learners have the autonomy to determine their own learning goals and pathways, and to pursue their interests at their own pace and style. CLC provides a variety of resources and services, such as access to technology, online resources, mentors and advisory assistance, classes, tutoring, workshops, and community events. Learners have the opportunity to connect with others who share their interests and goals, collaborate on projects, and find internships, job shadowing, and volunteer opportunities in the community to gain direct experience in their fields of interest.

Lifelong Canton resident Josh Pickel founded CLC in July 2022. Josh was a professional educator at the late elementary and middle school level for 5 years before founding CLC. He is also a GED Instructor for Spoon River College's Adult Education Program. ORGANIZATION SPOTLIGHT United Way for Fulton County

The United Way for Fulton County is pleased to announce it has partnered with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to provide a free, hand-selected, age-appropriate, high-quality book each month to registered children in Fulton County from birth to age five. Currently, there are 1690 children under the age of five living in Fulton County and eligible to enroll in this free program.

"We are so proud to bring this program to Fulton County," said Vickie Parry, Executive Director of the United Way for Fulton County. "The Imagination Library addresses the need for free or low-cost books for children in Fulton County. Shared book reading is a well-established vehicle for promoting early child language and development. This program will get age-appropriate books in homes throughout the county at no cost to the families."

Thanks to matching funds from the State of Illinois that the Dollywood Foundation receives, the cost to the United Way for Fulton County is greatly reduced. "With the matching funds available, our Board of Directors knew this was the right time for us to bring this program to our community. In the coming weeks we will be hosting events to sign children up and special fundraisers specifically for this program." Their first event will be on Saturday, November 11th at the Canton Family YMCA. Children can sign up now by visiting www.imaginationlibrary.com or through links on the United Way's Facebook page at United Way for Fulton County IL.

The Imagination Library is run by The Dollywood Foundation which partners with 501c3 not for profit organizations such as a United Way for Fulton County to register participants and distribute the books. The United Way for Fulton County raises funds to cover a portion of the cost of purchasing and mailing the books, registering participants, and managing the web-based book ordering system. The books are ordered, packaged, and mailed directly to the child by the Dollywood Foundation.
