#### **BACK 2 BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM**

A Message from Cole McDaniel Executive Director for the Spoon River Partnership for Economic Development

#### Back 2 Business (B2B) Grant Program

The State of Illinois announced its Back 2 Business (B2B) Grant Program designed to help small businesses who suffered revenue losses between 2019 and 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. A total of \$250 million in grants are available, ranging from \$5,000 to \$150,000. The eligibility for the program is very broad and most businesses with \$20 million or less in annual revenue are qualified. The program also has set aside and prioritizes certain hard hit business types like restaurants and hotels, smaller businesses (under \$5 million in revenue), businesses in low-income census tracts, and businesses who were not helped by other programs like Paycheck Protection Program and Business Interruption Grant.

The state's application portal opened to accept submissions starting on Wednesday, August 18. The last day for B2B applications will be October 11.

The Spoon River Partnership for Economic Development (SRPED) is here to help all of our businesses in Canton and Fulton County. Cole McDaniel, Executive Director for SRPED, is the local Community Navigator for the B2B Grant Program. He encourages business owners to take a look at the required documentation, pull these items together, and then contact Cole for assistance, if needed.

### HERE AT HOME SERIES YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

From an early age, Erika Sepich Leighton, a physical therapist with Graham Medical Group, never doubted that her love of Canton would bring her back to her hometown after college. Erika and her high school sweetheart, now husband, Chris, a bank executive at MidAmerica National Bank, live in Canton with their two young daughters.

"I love living in Canton, and all throughout my college career, I couldn't wait to be able to go back to Canton to live," Erika says. "I love that this is where my roots are from. My daughters are the fourth generation of Sepich Croatians residing in Canton. My dad is a Sepich and my mom was a Francisovich so we are definitely a part of the many Croatian clans who settled in the area."



Education, sports, and small-town support were other major factors in Erika's determination to return home, begin her career, and raise a family. The Sepich family's connection to local sports is legendary. At Canton High School, Erika excelled in softball, volleyball, and basketball. She believes her dedication and commitment to sports came from Grandfather Rudy.

"My grandfather, Rudy Sepich and I were extremely close, and he supported me in everything I tried," Erika recalls. "He inspired me. Many years ago, he dedicated himself to learning all he could about volleyball and eventually became Spoon River College's first volleyball coach. My grandpa died when I was in graduate school and his visitation was packed with caring Canton people all dressed in sports gear."

Erika also credits high school softball coach Harold Rose and basketball coach Layne Langholf with nurturing her confidence both in sports and in life.

"Mr. Rose was my softball coach during my Junior and Senior years. He believed in my capabilities and was always pushing me to believe in myself," Erika says. "He always found the positive in every situation and was a glass half full person. When I made 2nd team All-State for softball, he drove to my house to tell me in person. He was smiling ear to ear and seeing his excitement was very encouraging." Langholf was Erika's basketball coach during her sophomore, junior, and senior years and taught her the importance of "teamwork, mental strength, respect, and giving it your all." She recalls one Christmas season when the basketball team traveled to OSF Children's Hospital to sing Christmas carols to patients in the hospital.

"This opened up my eyes to the fragility of life, the desire to make a difference, and the importance of reaching out and showing love to others," she says. "Coach Langholf taught me that what we do off the court is so much more important than what happens on the court, and I truly respect him for that."

But it actually wasn't sports that led Erika to her career in physical therapy.

"I've wanted to become a physical therapist since 8th grade after writing a report on the profession," Erika says. "It was Ms. Schoon who made learning fun. I remember dissecting pigs in her class and being scared to death. She calmed my nerves, helped me, and I even enjoyed it!" In Ms. Schoon's class Erika learned all the bones in the human body and recalls having to write each bone out one by one for a test.

"I've always loved science and found the human body fascinating, but she was one of the first teachers who truly opened my eyes to the human (and pig) body, and I loved it."

Erika recalls that some of her classmates 'couldn't wait to get out of Canton' after graduation, but she has always been the opposite. After graduation from Canton High School in 2006, Erika purposefully selected Bradley University for her studies in physical therapy because of its exceptional program but also because it was close to home.

Erika lived on campus in Peoria for six years. But when she and Chris married, they chose to live in Canton and she commuted every day for her seventh and final year. When she graduated from Bradley with a Doctor of Physical Therapy (DST) degree, she immediately began working for Graham Medical Group as part of the tuition reimbursement program.

"Graham's tuition reimbursement program is excellent," Erika says. "I was able to afford my education, do an internship with Graham Medical Group, and then have a position waiting for me when I graduated." Erika worked full-time until her second daughter was born. Then Graham allowed her to switch to part-time so that she could enjoy both a professional career and motherhood. Eight years later she continues to work as a very popular physical therapist at Graham.

Perhaps Erika could receive higher wages in a large city, but she believes she is well compensated for her physical therapy services. She feels blessed to work for such a well-respected institution as Graham Medical Group and fortunate to be able to have the quality of life she's always dreamed of with family and lifelong friends nearby.

"Now I love going to work each day and being able to serve and help the community that has helped me so much. I plan to remain planted in my hometown as a "fan in the stands" to my future Little Giants,"



Erika states. "Ten years from now I will likely still be working as a physical therapist at Graham Medical Group and furthering my knowledge and expertise in a wide variety of areas including aquatic therapy, sports rehabilitation, and performance enhancement."

Current research indicates that rural areas success depends heavily on encouraging young professionals to stay, to return, or to choose small towns for life and work. Erika, along with the previously featured Here at Home young professionals – Jake Snowman, Mitchell Coonradt, Corrina Markland Pickel, Joshua Pickel, Christopher Jump, and Ashley Krulac – must certainly be counted as among Canton's best ambassadors.
