Canton Park District New Executive Director: Brent Wheeler

In the 101 years history of the Canton Park District, there have been only five executive directors. Canton native Brent Wheeler will become the sixth when he begins his new duties in that role September ninth.

Wheeler replaces Jon Johnson who retired June 28th of this year after serving as executive director since 2006. Johnson had been with the district since 2000. Canton Park District Board President Stephen Clark said "The district is grateful for Jon's dedicated service and leadership and looks forward to continuing its mission under Brent's guidance."



Wheeler is a 1993 graduate of Canton High School. He holds a 1997 Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice Sciences from Illinois State

University. In 2010 he earned a Master's Degree in Recreation, Sports, and Tourism from the University of Illinois. He has been with the Peoria Park District since 2001 where he briefly served in a variety of roles before being named in 2002 the RiverPlex Recreation and Wellness Supervisor. In 2014 he was chosen as Deputy Director of Parks and Recreation and has been in that position until accepting the Canton post.

Wheeler is no stranger to the Canton Park District, having served as a Park Board Commissioner from 2011 through 2021. He has also been an active volunteer locally with several organizations and extensive youth sports coaching.

Wheeler has long lived just outside Canton with his wife Mandy, and their three children...Sarah, Allison, and Nick.

Wheeler says he has a deep passion for parks and recreation and is eager to get started as director, adding he'll use his parks and recreation experience and long association with the Canton community to hit the ground running. He went on to say "I am beyond excited to be able to work in the town I have called home for most of my life and to be able to work with such a talented staff and dedicated Board of Commissioners. Canton has an incredible park system that has played a huge role in my life as well as the lives of my family. I look forward to the work of helping to maintain and enhance these special spaces and places." He especially wants to thank Interim Director, and longtime Canton Park District Office Manager, Kathy Walljasper, for doing a masterful job of bridging the gap while the new director search process was taking place.

The Canton Park District was established in 1923 and features more than 1,400 acres of property. It has long been considered one of the area's finest assets. Wheeler says he's committed to making it even better.

Opera House Plaza

Plans Move Forward For Opera House Plaza, Making Changes To Downtown Landscape

The historic Opera House Professional Building, once located at 45 East Side Square, was built in 1892, rebuilt after it burned in 1894, and survived an F3 tornado that leveled parts of the downtown in 1975. After falling into disrepair, it was restored and successfully converted to downtown office space by Kurt Huber, a Peoria developer.

On November 16, 2016, a deadly natural gas explosion severely damaged the building. Over 100 other buildings and businesses in the downtown area also sustained damage. The Opera House was eventually demolished, and the lot sat vacant for years. All that changed two years ago with a simple sketch by Carol Kohler, assistant to the mayor, proposing a new vision for the unused space in the center of the downtown.

In May of 2023, StudioK Architecture, in Princeton, Illinois, was hired by the City of Canton to create conceptual designs based upon the sketch. When the City approved the ideas presented, Farnsworth Group, an architectural and engineering company with offices in Peoria, was hired to develop a master plan for the Opera House Plaza project, including the architectural design and estimating costs. In March of 2024, the City Council approved the proposed budget, earmarking \$2.2 million in Business Development District funds. Farnsworth Group will oversee the bidding and construction process.

The design pays homage to the original building design, echoing the arched entrance with stone and open arches that cover a central walkway leading to a stage area. The hope is the space will be used for performances, public and private events that enhance the downtown, and engage the community. It will also have greenspace, seating areas, lighting, and landscaping.

Groundbreaking for the Plaza is anticipated for October, with a goal of completing the project in time for the Bicentennial Celebration in June of 2025. The planning committee was comprised of Carol Kohler, City of Canton; Amanda Sampson, then Marketing & Tourism Director for the Spoon River Partnership for Economic Development (SRPED); Michelle Spiva, Executive Director of SRPED; Carla Bobell, Executive Director of the Canton Area Chamber of Commerce; and Bruce Brown and Jacob Heck of Farnsworth Group.


Canton Bicentennial

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


